Entertainment

Not only an escape from the stresses and strains of everyday life, but also the desire to experience hopes and dreams that will transcend it through music, film, video games, and literature.

Politics

A trust in the ideals (e.g. Bill of Rights), power, and parties (e.g. Democrat, Republican) of government resembling a sacred respect and holding in governmental power a hope for societal progress.

Sports

The thrill of the win that manifests in devotion to athletes and dedication to teams.

Science

A faith that scientific knowledge and application of that knowledge in technology will lead to self-realization and progress.
